British Racing Ahead

The [July Festival at Newmarket](#) is the favourite of the year for many, with top class racing in an almost cosy setting, culminating in another leg of the Global Sprint Challenge, in the Gr.1 Darley July Cup - an international field again looking likely to add a different dimension to this historic dash. The Gr.1 Falmouth Stakes for fillies and mares, will probably bring the Guineas winners together again, taking on the seniors for the first time in another fascinating contest. There are seven Group races in all over the three days. In addition to the racing, the [Tattersalls July Sales](#) have increased in importance out of all recognition in the last few years and there are horses for every budget, including mares with foals at foot, some well bred fillies in and out of training, other horses in training that would be suitable for racing abroad at all levels, and even a yearling.

As July turns to August we can look forward to "[Glorious Goodwood](#)", held on the beautiful Sussex Downs within a mile or two of the sea, on a track that swirls, rises and falls in sympathy with a breathtaking landscape, the fixture sets a garden party atmosphere in a less formal setting than Ascot, with the action surprisingly close to the stands. Again some top class sport, notably the Gr.1 BGC Sussex Stakes over a mile - and the fillies too have another Gr.1 race over a mile, the Blue Square Nassau Stakes, some of 12 Group races during the week as well as some very valuable handicaps.

the redoutable Ask (GB) took the Gr. 1 Coronation Cup.

Then followed five magical days at a very prestigious and international [Royal Ascot](#), punctuated by winners from Australia, France, Ireland – and for the first time, the United States.

For the home side, Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum enjoyed a highly successful week with a quartet of winners, as did graduates of Tattersalls sales (13 individual races). And there was a heartwarming one, two for Cheveley Park Stud in the Gr. 2 Windsor Forest Stakes, to complement a very popular win for Henry Cecil and Prince Khalid Abdullah with Father Time in the Gr. 2 King Edward V11 Stakes.

There have been 31 winners of the [Breeze-up Bonus Scheme](#), to date – and Paco Boy, a Breeze Up purchase at DBS in 2007, further highlighted the success that these horses can enjoy, when winning the Gr. 1 Queen Anne Stakes.

Racing Post must be congratulated on their sponsorship of the new [Yearling Bonus Scheme](#) – details of which were published recently.

The visit of 25 leading [French Thoroughbred Breeders](#) to Newmarket, organised and hosted by BBM, proved to be a resounding success. Anna Pinnington has made forays to [Italy and Spain](#) – while BBM and Tattersalls will be embarking on a joint visit to India to publicise the lifting of the ban on the importation of bloodstock thereto from UK – subject to there being no cases of CEM, between now and 14 November.

The [TBA](#), who held an enlightening [Breeding Seminar](#) in Newmarket yesterday, have scheduled an EGM at Stanstead House on Monday 8 July – prior to the July Meeting, and Tattersalls July Sales, later in the week.
