High Achiever Award

For those who have displayed leadership qualities amongst their colleagues and peers, a desire to succeed in the industry and strong mentoring skills that have been to the benefit of those around them.

What are The Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards?

The Stud and Stable Staff Awards were initiated in 2005 to recognise the achievements of racing's key staff. They are generously sponsored by Godolphin and are run by the British Horseracing Authority, in conjunction with the Racing Post. In further support of the Awards, Godolphin has also increased the prize fund in 2010 to £120,000.

Who can enter this category?

The competition is open to any candidate currently employed as Stud or Stable Staff within England, Wales or Scotland at the time of nomination. **Anyone from within the industry can nominate, so owners, trainers, breeders and other industry staff can nominate those who they feel deserve an award.** Nominations for the High Achiever Award are open to those who can offer examples of their desire to progress within their chosen career and manage at least 2 members of staff.

Who will judge the award and on what criteria will the nominees be judged?

The judging panel will be made up of six influential racing figures, Chaired by Brough Scott. The Judges will be looking for examples of candidates who have displayed leadership qualities amongst their colleagues and peers, a desire to succeed in the industry and strong mentoring skills that have been to the benefit of those around them.

What is the prize for this Award category?

The overall winner of the award will be awarded £5,000 and their yard will also receive £5,000. Two runners-up will also receive £2,000 each, as will their yards.
