EXCITING EXTENSION TO THE REGIONAL STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (RSDP)

Following a very successful piloting of centred training activities in Middleham, we are delighted to announce that the Racing Foundation has agreed to fund an extension of the programme.

The newly launched RSDP will see Regional Coordinators operating in Lambourn, Malton, Middleham and Newmarket. They will organise and deliver a full programme of local and yard-based training and skills development activities. The Programme will not be confined to these areas as the two Multi-Purpose Training Vehicles will be on the road to provide support to outlying yards.

The programme is designed to provide existing staff with the opportunities to further develop their skills in a range of subject areas including:

- Advanced understanding of the racing industry
- Mentoring and coaching
- Horse health and welfare
- Personal fitness
- Equine nutrition
- Horse care and stable management
- Human first aid
- Schooling and work riding.

Overall management will be the responsibility of the Northern Racing College, who will also oversee activities in the North, whilst the British Racing School will oversee training provision in the Southern part of the country. RIDER COACHING PROGRAMME

Congratulations are extended to the second cohort of senior racing staff who have achieved their Level 1 Racing Coach qualification. This exciting new initiative for racing aims to provide senior staff with the coaching skills they need to develop the less experienced members of their team. Certificates were presented at a celebratory event kindly hosted by Catterick Racecourse (see below picture).

There are four more Racing Coach training courses planned for 2019. These will be held in Lambourn, Malton and two in Newmarket. The training is provided over five separate afternoons with a half-day assessment scheduled at the end of the course.
