There are no restrictions on workers from European Economic Area (EEA) countries at present under freedom of movement for workers under EU rules. Following Brexit, the UK Government has said that a new immigration system will be introduced for EEA workers.

The UK Government's 'Settled Status' scheme for EU and EEA citizens resident in the UK, and their families, closes on 31 December 2020 if the UK leaves the EU without a deal. This scheme gives the right to settle in the UK permanently following the UK's withdrawal from the EU.

The rights of Irish citizens to remain and work in the UK are unaffected owing to the Common Travel Area agreement between the UK and Ireland in the event of a no deal.

If there is a no deal, the UK Government has recently outlined that EU citizens who move to the UK following 31 January 2020 will be able to apply to a 'European Temporary Leave to Remain' scheme for a residency of up to 36 months.
